INVITATION FOR ANOINTING AND LAYING ON OF HANDS

Are any among you sick? They should call for the elders of the church and have them pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord. The prayer of faith will save the

sick, and the Lord will raise them up; and anyone who has committed sins will be forgiven. Therefore, confess your sins to one another, and pray for one another, so that you may be healed.

James 5.14–16

Almighty God,
in your word we are encouraged to pray for the sick
and anoint them with oil.
Grant that N who is anointed with this oil
may be strengthened by your Holy Spirit,
healed and restored, according to your good purposes;
through Jesus Christ our Saviour. **Amen.**

The minister anoints the sick person, saying

N, I anoint you in the name of the Lord Jesus. **Amen.**

or

In the faith of Jesus Christ, I anoint you in the name of
the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Laying on of hands

Others may join in prayer with the laying on of hands

God, the source of life and health,
grant you release from pain,
refreshment of spirit,
and wholeness in body and mind. **Amen.**

*The sick person may return thanks using his or her own words, or
the following prayer.*

Lord Jesus, your love never fails.
Thank you for this assurance
that your hands are stretched out to me,
to forgive, to strengthen, and to heal. **Amen.**

THE HOLY COMMUNION

Lord Jesus, stand beside us in our need and bring your healing love. Grant that we may know your presence as we break bread together. Give us your peace. **Amen.**

Offertory

Blessed are you, Lord, God of all creation.
Through your goodness we have this bread to offer,
which earth has given and human hands have made;
it will become for us the bread of life.

Blessed be God for ever.

Blessed are you, Lord, God of all creation.
Through your goodness we have this wine to offer,
fruit of the vine and work of human hands;
it will become our spiritual drink.

giving for our frailty eternal strength,
and restoring in us your perfect image.

**Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might,
Heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna in the highest.**

**Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

Merciful God, we thank you
for these gifts of your creation,
this bread and wine,
and we pray that by your Word and Holy Spirit,
we who eat and drink them
may be partakers of Christ's body and blood.

On the night he was betrayed Jesus took bread;
and when he had given you thanks
he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying,
'Take, eat. This is my body given for you.
Do this in remembrance of me.'

After supper, he took the cup,
and again giving you thanks
he gave it to his disciples, saying,
'Drink from this, all of you.
This is my blood of the new covenant
shed for you and for many
for the forgiveness of sins.
Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.'

Christ has died.

Christ is risen.

Christ will come again.

With this bread and this cup,
we remember the saving death of your Son,
his resurrection and ascension,
and his promise to be with us for ever.

In the power of the Holy Spirit,

bring us to eternal life with Christ,
as we look for his coming in glory,
and for the heavenly banquet
prepared for all your people.

**Blessing and honour and glory and power
are yours for ever and ever. Amen.**

**Our Father in heaven,
hallowed be your name,
your kingdom come,
your will be done,
on earth as in heaven.**

Give us today our daily bread.

**Forgive us our sins
