LITURGY OF THE WORD

A reading from Saint Paul's first letter to the Corinthians (4.1-5)

¹ Think of us in this way, as servants of Christ and stewards of God's mysteries. ² Moreover, it is required of stewards that they should be found trustworthy. ³ But with me it is a very small thing that I should be judged by you or by any human court. I do not even judge myself. ⁴ I am not aware of anything against myself, but I am not thereby acquitted. It is the Lord who judges me. ⁵ Therefore do not pronounce judgement before the time, before the Lord comes, who will bring to light the things now hidden in darkness and will disclose the purposes of the heart. Then each one will receive commendation from God.

✠ ***Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ***

³³ Then they said to Jesus, ‘John’s disciples, like the disciples of the Pharisees, frequently fast and pray, but your disciples eat and drink.’ ³⁴ Jesus said to them, ‘You cannot make wedding-guests fast while the bridegroom is with them, can you? ³⁵ The days will come when the bridegroom will be taken away from them, and then they will fast in those days.’ ³⁶ He also told them a parable: ‘No one tears a piece from a new garment and sews it on an old garment; otherwise the new will be torn, and the piece from the new will not match the old.’ ³⁷ And no one puts new wine into old wineskins; otherwise the new wine will burst the skins and will be spilled, and the skins will be destroyed. ³⁸ But new wine must be put into fresh wineskins. ³⁹ And no one after drinking old wine desires new wine, but says, “The old is good.” ’

INVITATION FOR ANOINTING AND LAYING ON OF HANDS

Are any among you sick? They should call for the elders of the church and have them pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord. The prayer of faith will save the sick, and the Lord will raise them up; and anyone who has committed sins will be forgiven. Therefore, confess your sins to one another, and pray for one another, so that you may be healed. *James 5.14–16*

Prayer for healing:

Almighty God,

in your word we are encouraged to pray for the sick and anoint them with oil.

Grant that N who is anointed with this oil may be strengthened by your Holy Spirit, healed and restored, according to your good purposes; through Jesus Christ our Saviour.

Amen.

The minister anoints the sick person, saying

N, I anoint you in the name of the Lord Jesus.

Amen.

or

In the faith of Jesus Christ, I anoint you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Laying on of hands

Others may join in with the laying on of hands

God, the source of life and health,
grant you release from pain,
refreshment of spirit,
and wholeness in body and mind.

Amen.

The sick person may return thanks using his or her own words, or the following prayer.

Lord Jesus, your love never fails.
Thank you for this assurance
that your hands are stretched out to me,
to forgive, to strengthen, and to heal.

Amen.
