LITURGY OF THE WORD

A reading from Job (38.1, 12-21, 40.3-5)

- 38 ¹ Then the Lord answered Job out of the whirlwind:
¹² 'Have you commanded the morning since your days began,
and caused the dawn to know its place,
¹³ so that it might take hold of the skirts of the earth,
and the wicked be shaken out of it?
¹⁴ It is changed like clay under the seal,
and it is dyed like a garment.
¹⁵ Light is withheld from the wicked,
and their uplifted arm is broken.
¹⁶ 'Have you entered into the springs of the sea,
or walked in the recesses of the deep?
¹⁷ Have the gates of death been revealed to you,
or have you seen the gates of deep darkness?
¹⁸ Have you comprehended the expanse of the earth?
Declare, if you know all this.
¹⁹ 'Where is the way to the dwelling of light,
and where is the place of darkness,
²⁰ that you may take it to its territory
and that you may discern the paths to its home?
