



FROM PARISH COUNCIL

On Sunday 5th December, after the Eucharist, all parishioners are invited to join a discussion over morning tea in Gill Hall about the Parish involvement in the inter-faith Australian Religious Response to Climate Action. You may have seen the banner outside St George the Martyr in Queenscliff and read something of the campaign in *Lovers of the Place*.

There will also be a brief introduction to the process of Re-Imagining the Future, which commences with a Parish Council workshop instead of our Council meeting on 13 December. Opportunities for general parishioner involvement in planning will follow.

As mentioned in last week's Newsletter, we plan to have a working bee on the Saturday morning before we commence in the new church each month. This will keep us on top of many maintenance chores and shouldn't be too demanding. We suggest all or part of 9.00-11.00am, followed by morning tea. Of course, everyone is welcome! Parish Council has decided to rent out the House of Prayer for summer holiday lettings (through Kerley's Real Estate) from as early as practicable in December through to Easter 2022. This is a significant but necessary development to generate some much-needed income for essential maintenance on both sites of St Georges and St James.

Covid Update. Please see below the latest Diocesan Policy on the Vaccine status of Worshippers



Dear brothers and sisters

Restriction changes

From Friday, 19 November, there will be no attendance limits or density rule for fully vaccinated church services, weddings, funerals, groups or meetings in the church facilities. Masks do not need to be worn, though we recommend masks when the church is full. We recommend good ventilation.

For a church service, wedding or funeral for a congregation of unknown vaccine status, the limit is 50 people. Masks must be worn (other than by the one person leading/singing/preaching), and the 4sqm rule remains. The limit of 50 does not include those necessary for conducting a funeral, or the wedding couple, celebrant and one photographer at a wedding, and we assume does not include the person leading a regular church service.

Any groups or meetings in church facilities are for vaccinated people only. The exception is for a group or meeting for religious activity of people of an unknown status. The limit is 50 people, including the leader, and the 4sqm rule applies.

From Friday, vaccination status applies to those aged 12+. Anyone under 12 is regarded as fully vaccinated. Refreshments can be served before or after fully vaccinated events. For services of people of unknown status, refreshments can be served outdoors only, and tables and chairs are not allowed.

At this stage the common cup at communion is still not allowed. We will discuss this issue with health authorities next week.

Op shops can only be open for fully vaccinated customers. Op shop staff must be fully vaccinated

Only fully vaccinated people can work in the church premises. We will update further if needed tomorrow afternoon.
