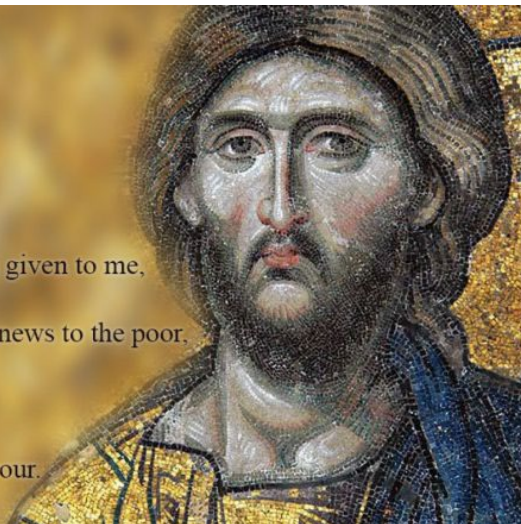

### Luke 4:16-30

to proclaim liberty to captives  
and to the blind new sight,  
to set the downtrodden free,  
to proclaim the Lord's year of favour.



### TODAY'S GOSPEL

Jesus found in the text of the prophet Isaiah exactly the right words to describe his mission of proclaiming the Good News. Over the coming year, as we listen week by week to Luke's gospel, we will see how this mission played out.

Our task as a parish community is to do likewise. No longer in 1<sup>st</sup> Century Palestine, but in 21<sup>st</sup> Century Australia and locally in the Borough of Queenscliffe.

### FROM FR PETER

This weekend I'm announcing my retirement. My last day in the parish will be **Sunday 24<sup>th</sup> April**, in three months' time.

I mentioned at our Annual Parish Meeting last November that 2022 was the year, because I am required to offer the Archbishop my resignation before my 70<sup>th</sup> birthday. I was born in 1952, so the maths is pretty straight forward!

Over the next three months, between now and 24 April, my focus will be on helping the parish, especially through the leadership team of Parish Council, prepare for the new beginning which invariably comes with a new incumbent. Equally important, together, we need to say our goodbyes. Please pray for the parish in this time of transition, and please, pray for Helen and me.

Hello fellow parishioners and readers of *Lovers of the Place*. It is only a year since I joined the Parish, so I am probably a stranger to many, even though I am Secretary and Warden of Parish Council. However, my colleagues and Fr Peter have patiently guided me through the new waters down here. I came from a very small town in Central Victoria (Dunolly), with a small and shrinking congregation that attended our beautiful church of St John's. Our last big "Hurrah" was a wonderful 150th

celebration in December 2019, with bishops, former ministers, parishioners and most of the district gathering for a joyful service and hymn singing in full voice, with Esme bringing out the best of our resonant Fincham organ (the same that is in St George's). Dunolly was part of the Parish of Maryborough and Avoca and poor Rev Heather Blackman had 6 or 7 congregations to manage.

Life in Dunolly started for me and my family in 2004 when my husband, Richard Wright, took up the position of Co-ordinating Magistrate for the Loddon Region - from Kyneton to Mildura. With children finished school, we were drawn to Central Victoria and came across an amazing house that we quickly bought and had to decide how to make it all work. Richard became the local equivalent of "The Irish RM" of Sommerville and Ross fame, while I was able to continue as a member of the Mental Health Tribunal, working mostly in Bendigo and Ballarat. We embarked on an impressive restoration project with the house, from slate roof to cellar, and developed a very beautiful garden in the midst of the Millennial Drought. Our friend and garden designer, Dianne Thomson, reckons there is magic in Dunolly soil - once you add water.

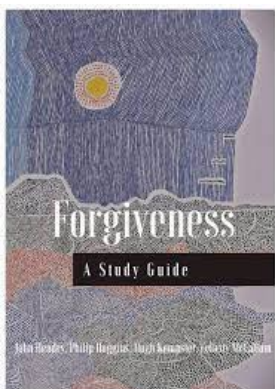
As a "cleanskin" in a small community, I was invited to chair the planning committee for the 150th celebrations soon after we arrived and from that beginning, I became increasingly involved and committed to community groups and district committees. I think my background in social work, especially social work education, enabled me to galvanise community energy and access resources that we needed to achieve our goals. It was also essential to maintain good humour and to listen - there is no personal ownership of wisdom and good ideas.

Almost by accident, we bought Dunolly's original licensed grocers store in 2005, as much as anything to keep the oldest licence in Victoria alive and to keep the doors open for another business on Broadway [the main street]. The team of tradesmen from home moved down the street to hold together another historic building and to challenge the termites. I opened what might be euphemistically called a regional wine and food Providore, *Wright on Broadway*, that surprised everyone by staying afloat for 10 years until it was sold in 2016. It was a special place and evolved to be a cafe, a fine restaurant once a month, an important source of great local produce and wine, a gallery, a concert venue, an employer of local young people and a gathering place for significant family and social events. Thank heavens we only operated three days a week, plus a day for "foraging" and preparation.

There were many significant projects and events during my years in Dunolly: perhaps the most substantial legacy is the restoration of Dunolly's remarkable public buildings in the Historic Precinct, comprising Town Hall, Court House, police lock-up and stables. Once again, teams of local craftsmen and pro bono experts rose to the challenges. As the Historic Precinct Committee determinedly held on to the purse-strings, we were able to achieve outstanding results for a modest budget.

Life changed dramatically in 2015 when my husband was diagnosed with motor neurone disease, which we subsequently found out was hereditary. We were able to squeeze in some memorable times before his death in March 2017 and, most importantly, he could enjoy the early days of our only grandchild. I made the challenging decision to move from Dunolly to be closer to family and to help as required with childcare - the pathway of so many of us! All this led to first Ocean Grove and now Drysdale. I have felt "at home" with Peter's spiritual leadership at Queenscliff/Point Lonsdale and a warm bond with parishioners and Parish Councillors. To discover the Fincham organ at St George's provides a beautiful link with my life, community and congregation in Dunolly.
