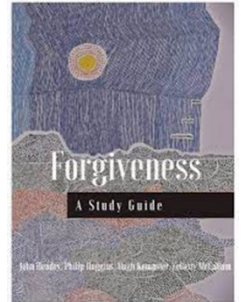

'RE-IMAGINING THE FUTURE' –DISCERNING GOD'S FUTURE FOR US.

The first of three Parish Consultations will happen this Sunday, 20 February, following the 10.00am Eucharist, over a cup of tea/coffee in Gill Hall Garden.

Parish Council, Incumbency Committee members, with Archdeacon Jill McCoy, have been working on the 'Re-imagining' process and are now keen to consult with the parish. For example, one item for discussion will be the introduction of video live streaming and the use of Zoom to our parish life. (pl. read this week's 'INTRODUCING' p.2). What are your thoughts on this? At each Consultation Session there will be opportunity to raise anything else you would like Parish Council to consider.

There will be two more consultation sessions. These in turn will help Parish Council develop a new Mission Action Plan (MAP) for the parish which will guide us up to 2025. In the immediate term, the MAP will help the Incumbency Committee, under the Archbishop, appoint the new vicar.

INTRODUCING CAROL MCDONOUGH



2009, The St James House of Prayer brochure glowed at Trinity College Theological School. 'Come and see'. I brought from 'all over' to the HoP's vibrant ministry of hospitality and parish immersion. Inlander, walking the foreshore, swimming, gazing at dawn and sunsets over sea water, Santa Casa's Labyrinth, I greatly miss. Become regular retreatant, I know differences from being a summer camper for decades, worshipping across our Bay: we are not visitors, we are living in parish worship.

For fourteen years, I have felt one of the parish. I have watched the parish evolve from two centres to one parish with the central heartbeat of what we now call QLA. It is peace participating 'live' in our heartbeat of St George and St James liturgical life of the Mass, Baptisms and Funerals. It's the third year tapping into the strong link video live-streaming into my home. Out of the Mass and back into it, flows the daily life near and afar - parish ministry, prayer and meditation. We pray in the Mass, 'send us out in the power of the Spirit', gives practical love to the 'world'. I hope our love flows back.

Throughout covid years, as my community life became increasingly digital, during lockdowns, now in personal protective isolation for my health safety, it remains joy and lifeline to be able to worship by streaming Sunday Mass, the Daily Office as much as I have been able and less, morning meditations. I have participated in parish online study. I look forward to the hybrid Lenten Study on Forgiveness.

Through the Parish ARCC membership, I committed to the COP26 fortnight 'at' St Georges, the bell rung then noon prayer and meditations. Initiated by Bishop Philip Huggins, enacted by Fr Peter. These were 'batted' by Fr Peter to Elaine and John George of ARCC Western Australia, continuing Tuesday noons. More widely, through Bishop Philip, looking to COP27, we are anchored as one 'fresh initiatives of prayer and meditation' of the Interfaith Liaison Committee to the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change. We 'hold hands' around Earth with all peoples, with all species.

Pre-covid, I participated in larger retreats in Queenscliff, of the Parish, of the Antonian Network grown out of the House of Prayer, once, by invitation, the Oodthenong clergy retreat, the parish welcome to the first Syrian refugees - after an Evening Prayer when I was in HoP. When HoP retreatant, twice I have been anointed by Fr Peter within the Friday Healing Mass. With that Mass, for years I prayed silently, physically distanced. Gratefully, I have continued to request the faithful, sometimes longterm ministry, of intercession for my family and others in need of Christ's healing, in times of illness, death and difficult life circumstances, to recover, giving graced capacity to live on.

During these fourteen years I have slow-studied Christian ecumenical theology and spiritual formation at the University of Divinity, since 2018 with Saint Athanasius Coptic College. When I wasn't in liturgies or at the beach, on the House of Prayer table I often worked on assignments, also articles printed in the British Jesuit Journal, *The Way*. Through Fr Peter, tracing St Antony the Great of Egypt was reprinted by St Mary's Hermitage, Kent, in their online *Silentio*. Fruit of QLA ministry, I see my study and writing enriched by the parish and House of Prayer, along with *Green Hermits* on YouTube. 2016, I was videographed in the Chapel, the Library and environs at the (then) United Faculty of Theology, while new to smartphones, stunned, I was interviewed on mine - from Rome!

I have tried to 'tell the ways' I experience the commandments of love of QLA parish in the household of God. Four years ago, a retiring Bishop was given foresight. He reflected in his last Synod charge: Geography will become less important. For me and some others, it already had. I am at home in iso here - 200km away, digitally with QLA, when able- living in the Parish House of Prayer. I am grateful.

PS Mass 13 Feb: Parish Council with Fr Peter wants our comments about what we have missed these past years, how we re-imagine our future. I wonder, have I reflected (before that Mass!) on a way? Of how a far-away person who identifies as hybrid parishioner (there, here) sees hybrid Parish life?

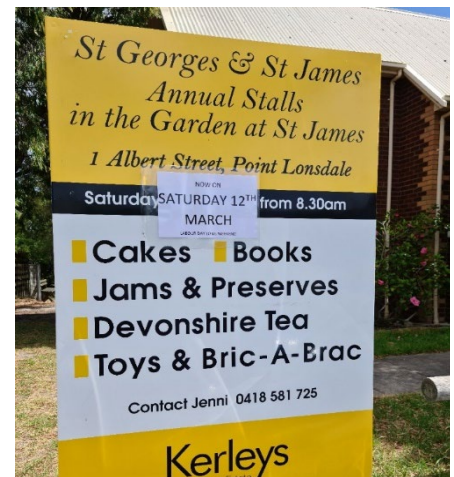

GOSPEL OF THE DAY Luke 6.27-38

27 'But I say to you that listen, Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, 28 bless those who curse you, pray for those who abuse you. 29 If anyone strikes you on the cheek, offer the other also; and from anyone who takes away your coat do not withhold even your shirt. 30 Give to everyone who begs from you; and if anyone takes away your goods, do not ask for them again. 31 Do to others as you would have them do to you. 32 'If you love those who love you, what credit is that to you? For even sinners love those who love them. 33 If you do good to those who do good to you, what credit is that to you? For even sinners do the same. 34 If you lend to those from whom you hope to receive, what credit is that to you? Even sinners lend to sinners, to receive as much again. 35 But love your enemies, do good, and lend, expecting nothing in return. Your reward will be great, and you will be children of the Most High; for he is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked. 36 Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful. 37 'Do not judge, and you will not be judged; do not condemn, and you will not be condemned. Forgive, and you will be forgiven; 38 give, and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over, will be put into your lap; for the measure you give will be the measure you get back.'
