Dear people of St George's and St James',

On Friday 22nd the Church commemorates Mary Magdalene. She is one of the more intriguing figures mentioned a number of times in the gospels, most notably in the Risen Jesus' appearance to, and conversation with, her on the first Easter morning.

She is one of 6 "Marys" referred to the gospels and has traditionally (but probably falsely) been identified as the "woman who lived a sinful life" (Luke 7:37), with her iconographic symbol being the ointment jar from which that character anointed Our Lord, and she has been seen as the "true penitent".

Since the rise of feminism much has been made of the fact that she was, in one sense, the first witness of the Resurrection and that over the centuries church authorities have marginalised her in comparison to the male apostles and other great figures of the Early Church, despite persistent legends about her leadership and missionary travels in the first

decades of Christianity.

Writers of popular fiction, and of musicals and movies based on the bible, have not been shy of hot speculations about her relationship with Jesus and her involvement in what those in ecclesiastical power might have considered heretical practices and teachings. It all makes for a good story.

Many would say that her persistent presence in the Christian imagination is a reminder of the need for us to consider "the feminine" in theology and spirituality.


FROM COVID OFFICER
