Dear people of St George's and St James',

One of the earliest U.S. Presidents, Thomas Jefferson, did not approve of a number of things in the bible so he took it upon himself to, with a razor blade, literally cut out the bits he didn't like, and he constructed his own cut-and-paste "approved version"! No doubt today's gospel passage would have been one of the sections that ended up in the White House's W.P.B.

It seems on first reading that Our Lord is advocating strife and tension in the home ... but isn't Christianity supposed to be about "Happy Families "?

This matter raises a few issues:

1/ If everyone followed President Jefferson's example we'd end up with a multitude of "approved versions"" of the bible ... and a lot of waste paper!

2/ There certainly have been times in Christian history where to be a faithful Christian has meant rejecting the traditions and the values with which one has been brought up, even if this has involved going against family members.

3/ The challenge for Christians is always to receive all the biblical material – without picking and choosing – and to ask the Holy Spirit to interpret it for us, given our own time and our own circumstances. As it says in the Book of Common Prayer, we are to hear the Scriptures, "read, mark, learn , and inwardly digest them".

As we do so we may find that today's gospel has something very uncomfortable to say to us, as to where our priorities really lie. Tim Gibson

You know how to interpret the appearance of earth and sky, but why do you not know how to interpret the present time? ⁵⁷ 'And why do you not judge for yourselves what is right? ⁵⁸ Thus, when you go with your accuser before a magistrate, on the way make an effort to settle the case, or you may be dragged before the judge, and the judge hand you over to the officer, and the officer throw you in prison. ⁵⁹ I tell you, you will never get out until you have paid the very set out a set of the set of

JamesFerguson, (Left) 1818-1894 and James Urie (right) 1828-1890 Two Scotsmen from Ayrshire emigrated in 1852. By the late 1850s Ferguson & Urie were concentrating solely on glazing, lead light and stained glass windows. They had many commissions in churches, significant public buildings and private mansions. In 1861 they displayed their 'Ornamental Glazing in Lead' at the Victorian Exhibition. By 1863 they had the monopoly in design and manufacture of stained glass windows in the Colony. In 1874 they advertised new premises for '...Rolled Plate, Cathedral, and coloured glass ...Stained glass and lead lights at Curzon Street and 10 Collins Street East Melbourne'.

Ferguson & Urie exhibited their work at the Inter-colonial Exhibition and were awarded a silver medal and First Prize.
