


## REMINDER: FROM NEXT WEEK AND FOR SEPTEMBER, SUNDAY WORSHIP WILL BE AT ST JAMES POINT LONSDALE

Dear people of St George's and St James',

You may have read, or seen on TV, that a ""breakaway" Anglican diocese has been formed in Australia, headed by the retired Archbishop of Sydney. This move was not unexpected or unprecedented.

Taking an historical view, it was the hope of Queen Elizabeth I, and many that followed her, that the Church of England would be a kind of "umbrella" church, whose members would be allowed to disagree with each other about points of doctrine, where they thought necessary, but nevertheless were prepared to worship together, and stay together, and generally speaking — (even though tolerance, restraint and learning tend not to be universal characteristics of mankind) — this attitude has eventuated, and has continued on in the Anglican churches (such as ours in Australia) — which derive from the "C of E".



However, there have been some exceptions: In the late 17<sup>th</sup> century some Anglicans broke away because they could not swear allegiance to the Hanoverian monarchs who they claimed had illegally replaced the Stuarts; in the 18<sup>th</sup> century the Methodists, who had started as an Anglican sub-group, formed their own church; as recently as the 1970's others broke away to form their own version of the Anglican Church because they disapproved of the modernisation of the Prayer Book; and then in the '80s and '90s others broke away over the Ordination of Women issue.


The formation of this new "Diocese of Southern Cross" has been in the offing for some years as many Australian Anglicans believe that our church has succumbed to what they are say are ""unbiblical" views about sex and marriage, particularly the idea that the Church could welcome and "bless" same-sex marriages. Remember that a significant minority voted "NO" in the same-sex marriage plebiscite a few years ago.

We will see how this all pans out in the days to come. Congregations of this new diocese may appear around us in Victoria. Difficulties will arise if they attempt to meet and worship on the properties of the ""official" Anglican Church of Australia. We may see unsavoury litigations – which of course the media will publicise.

It is all rather sad, but at the root of it all is the vexed question as to how one interprets the bible . It has been said that one of the weaknesses of Anglicanism is its incapacity to satisfy those who want rough and ready answers to complicated issues. The question remains: can one live with the consequences of different interpretations and yet still worship together and stay in fellowship ? Tim Gibson

#### **GOSPEL OF THE DAY**

#### Luke 14.1, 14.7-14

<sup>1</sup> On one occasion when Jesus was going to the house of a leader of the Pharisees to eat a meal on the sabbath, they were watching him closely. <sup>7</sup> When he noticed how the guests chose the places of honour, he told them a parable. <sup>8</sup> 'When you are invited by someone to a wedding banquet, do not sit down at the place of honour, in case someone more distinguished than you has been invited by your host; <sup>9</sup> and the host who invited both of you may come and say to you, "Give this person your place", and then in disgrace you would start to take the lowest place. <sup>10</sup> But when you are invited, go and sit down at the lowest place, so that when your host comes, he may say to you, "Friend, move up higher"; then you will be honoured in the presence of all who sit at the table with you. <sup>11</sup> For all who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted.' <sup>12</sup> He said also to the one who had invited him, 'When you give a luncheon or a dinner, do not invite your friends or your brothers or your relatives or rich neighbours, in case they may invite you in return, and you would be repaid. <sup>13</sup> But when you give a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind. <sup>14</sup> And you will be blessed, because they cannot repay you, for you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous.'
