# REMINDER - Sunday worship for AUGUST is at St Georges Queenscliff



Dear people of St George's and St James',

On each of the last few Sundays you might have noticed that our first Sunday bible reading has been from one of the Old Testament prophets.

Their general theme has been doom and gloom well, doom and gloom for those to whom their writings were directed, namely the people, and more specially the leaders, of the kingdoms that existed in what we call the Holy Land in the centuries before Christ.

You might wonder why we have these

somewhat bizarre readings in our Sunday worship? What have the warnings and diatribes from nearly 3000 years ago got to do with us?

I think the answer is that the people of the Israelite kingdoms of those days thought that they were indeed God's chosen people – and they had good reason to believe that, given their history of deliverance from slavery in Egypt, etc. However, this had led to a lot of complacency, and departure from the true religion of Yahweh (a.k.a. Jehovah) people had been flirting with other gods, and had been departing from the moral strictures of the Hebrew law (the Ten Commandments, etc.) ... and then foreign powers had started to attack them.

The prophets saw "cause and effect" here and used the woes afflicting the kingdoms as a reason to call the people back to their original faith.

We, as Christians, read these readings to remind us that we – "God's chosen people", in another sense – always need to be called back to the basics of <u>our</u> faith. In particular we need to be alert to the "gods" and idols who <u>we</u> are so often tempted to worship: consumerism, material progress, security, exclusivism, national or racial pride, etc. Tim Gibson
