Reflection

The Gospels often tell us that Jesus spoke parables to the masses but gave the explanation to the inner group of "disciples'. What is this? Beer for the <u>hoi poloi</u> and cognac for the <u>cognoscente</u>? Such distinctions sound suspiciously like "simple faith" for the laity and a robust understanding for the ordained. And nothing could be more remote from Jesus and his close friends, who it could be said, didn't have an ENTER score among them.

The distinction is not one of the intellect but of discernment . . . "as they were able to hear it". Those who heard and acted upon it became disciples. They left the crowd and became part of His enterprise, telling the story along with him. So long as they listened to the story they could speak, for they knew the story had something central to do with the One who told it. They discovered that telling the story had little to do with intellectual assent when 'personal convictions' prevented people from accepting the story. It is, it seems, frighteningly possible to hear the explanation . . . and return to the crowd. Ron Noone

GOSPEL OF THE DAY Luke 16.19-31

¹⁹ 'There was a rich man who was dressed in purple and fine linen and who feasted sumptuously every day. ²⁰ And at his gate lay a poor man named Lazarus, covered with sores, ²¹ who longed to satisfy his hunger with what fell from the rich man's table; even the dogs would come and lick his sores. ²² The poor man died and was carried away by the angels to be with Abraham. The rich man also died and was buried. ²³ In Hades, where he was being tormented, he looked up and saw Abraham far away with Lazarus by his side. ²⁴ He called out, "Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue; for I am in agony in these flames." ²⁵ But Abraham said, "Child, remember that during your lifetime you received your good things, and Lazarus in like manner evil things; but now he is comforted here, and you are in agony. ²⁶ Besides all this, between you and us a great chasm has been fixed, so that those who might want to pass from here to you cannot do so, and no one can cross from there to us." ²⁷ He said, "Then, father, I beg you to send him to my father's house— ²⁸ for I have five brothers—that he may warn them, so that they will not also come into this place of torment." ²⁹ Abraham replied, "They have Moses and the prophets; they should listen to them." ³⁰ He said, "No, father Abraham; but if someone goes to them from the dead, they will repent." ³¹ He said to him, "If they do not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be convinced even if someone rises from the dead." '
