

Reminder Sunday Worship at St James Point Lonsdale



Dear people of St George's and St James',

It is only once every three years that we have a reading in our Sunday service from the Letter to Philemon, one of the shortest books in the New Testament. In fact our reading today is the whole letter.

Unlike others of Paul"s epistles this is a short personal letter probably written during his imprisonment, perhaps in Rome between 61 and 63 A.D.

The letter concerns a runaway slave named Onesimus who Paul had met on one of his missionary journeys. Paul

would like to have Onesimus continue with him as a companion in his apostolic work, but first he has to send the slave back to his legal master to obtain Onesimus' official release from service. Paul asks Philemon to treat Onesimus like a Christian brother and close family member.

This raises the interesting question: did the early Christians tolerate the institution of slavery ? They probably had little alternative as they mostly had no vote and no political voice, and to use violence to oppose slavery would have been against the spirit of Christ. What they could do (and this letter is possibly among the first in the "campaign") was to foster such good relations between masters and slaves with the intention of making the idea of one man owning another unthinkable.

One of the scandals of church history is that it took so long for Christians to oppose and dismantle the institution of slavery particularly in those jurisdictions where they did have political power.

We trust that the Christian gospel has the power to transform all human relationships , husband and wife, parent and child, one member and another in the Christian fellowship – where people are placed in new positions of responsibility towards each other and in new attitudes of mutual concern.

GOSPEL OF THE DAY Luke 14.25-35

²⁵ Now large crowds were travelling with him; and he turned and said to them, ²⁶ 'Whoever comes to me and does not hate father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, yes, and even life itself, cannot be my disciple. ²⁷ Whoever does not carry the cross and follow me cannot be my disciple. ²⁸ For which of you, intending to build a tower, does not first sit down and estimate the cost, to see whether he has enough to complete it? ²⁹ Otherwise, when he has laid a foundation and is not able to finish, all who see it will begin to ridicule him, ³⁰ saying, "This fellow began to build and was not able to finish." ³¹ Or what king, going out to wage war against another king, will not sit down first and consider whether he is able with ten thousand to oppose the one who comes against him with twenty thousand? ³² If he cannot, then, while the other is still far away, he sends a delegation and asks for the terms of peace. ³³ So therefore, none of you can become my disciple if you do not give up all your possessions. ³⁴ 'Salt is good; but if salt has lost its taste, how can its saltiness be restored? ³⁵ It is fit neither for the soil nor for the manure heap; they throw it away. Let anyone with ears to hear listen!'
