With the news of the death of Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II, we join with the entire


Anglican Communion to show the deepest gratitude for her long reign, her deep Christian faith, and her love for her subjects as well as for the world. An old booklet gave an appropriate tribute to Her Majesty's faith with the title, "The Servant Queen, and the King She Serves."

Her majesty died on the feast of the nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary,

our heavenly Queen. How sacred that this earthly queen was born to eternal life on this day. Let us pray:

Oh God, whose mercies cannot be numbered: Accept our prayers on behalf of your servant, Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II, and grant her an entrance into the land of light and joy, in the fellowship of all your saints; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

And we pray for His Majesty the King, as he assumes his new office even as he mourns his mother. This Sunday also happens to fall on the anniversary of the September 11th attacks, and we will remember the many earthly lives lost on that tragic day. And as we honour the memory of the thousands of lives who stepped into eternity that day, we are given a Gospel passage that reminds us that each and every life lost that day is precious and known to the heart of God.





St. Cyril, who died in 444 A.D. in his Homilies, 21, interpreted the parable as the shepherd standing for Jesus, the ninety-nine sheep as the angels and the one lost sheep as humankind. Luke is also implying that Jesus himself is the interpretation of his parables because he shows how God's acts of love are taking place now in his ministry which is a cause for rejoicing in heaven. The parables are concerned with joy which surpasses expectations. Joy both on earth and in heaven for those who were lost and now have been found.

GOSPEL OF THE DAY Luke 15.1-10

¹ Now all the tax-collectors and sinners were coming near to listen to him. ² And the Pharisees and the scribes were grumbling and saying, 'This fellow welcomes sinners and eats with them.' ³ So he told them this parable: ⁴ 'Which one of you, having a hundred sheep and losing one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the wilderness and go after the one that is lost until he finds it? ⁵ When he has found it, he lays it on his shoulders and rejoices. ⁶ And when he comes home, he calls together his friends and neighbours, saying to them, "Rejoice with me, for I have found my sheep that was lost." ⁷ Just so, I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous people who need no repentance. ⁸ 'Or what woman having ten silver coins, if she loses one of them, does not light a lamp, sweep the house, and search carefully until she finds it? ⁹ When she has found it, she calls together her friends and neighbours, saying, "Rejoice with me, for I have found the coin that I had lost." ¹⁰ Just so, I tell you, there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents.'


Games Day returns to St James, Point Lonsdale, Monday 3rd October.
