


Dear people of St George's and St James', It's good to be back after my time away and I am very grateful that the Rev'd Dr Ron Noone was able to be the "locum's locum" for the duration. I travelled first to W.A. with some 25 (of the 40) members of the Australian Welsh Male Choir, of which I have been member for 5 years. We performed in concerts with other choirs in Geraldton, Perth, Mandurah, Busselton and Albany, the biggest one being in Perth where we joined up with the Perth and visiting Sydney male choirs -- over 100 on stage. I'm sure many in the audience had never experienced a concert with so many male-only voices. There were tears in the faces (for the right reasons!) of Welsh

and Welsh-descended people when we sang our bracket of songs in their unique native tongue.

The trip also included tourist time, the highlights being the HMAS Sydney II Memorial in Geraldton, wild flowers en route and in the spectacular Kings' Park in Perth, and the Anzac memorial centre in Albany – a town of great significance in Australia's World War I story. After that I went to Uluru for 3 days, a great thrill

to be at the centre of this vast continent and to experience the amazing nature and colours of the land forms and landscape, and to learn something of the cultural and spiritual significance of that area to the local Anangu people. At the end of each concert in W.A. our choir asked the audience to join us in singing the national anthem. It was noticeable how few lips were moving. This was disappointing, but then I suppose we are not really a nation of singers (c.f. the Welsh, the Tongans, etc.). One hopes we can demonstrate our patriotism in other appropriate ways as we share in this land of vast distances and great beauty. Tim Gibson

GOSPEL OF THE DAY Luke 18.1-14

¹ Then Jesus told them a parable about their need to pray always and not to lose heart. ² He said, 'In a certain city there was a judge who neither feared God nor had respect for people. ³ In that city there was a widow who kept coming to him and saying, "Grant me justice against my opponent." 4 For a while he refused; but later he said to himself, "Though I have no fear of God and no respect for anyone, 5 yet because this widow keeps bothering me, I will grant her justice, so that she may not wear me out by continually coming." ' 6 And the Lord said, 'Listen to what the unjust judge says. 7 And will not God grant justice to his chosen ones who cry to him day and night? Will he delay long in helping them? 8 I tell you, he will quickly grant justice to them. And yet, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?' 9 He also told this parable to some who trusted in themselves that they were righteous and regarded others with contempt: 10 'Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a taxcollector. ¹¹ The Pharisee, standing by himself, was praying thus, "God, I thank you that I am not like other people: thieves, rogues, adulterers, or even like this tax-collector. 12 I fast twice a week; I give a tenth of all my income." 13 But the tax-collector, standing far off, would not even look up to heaven, but was beating his breast and saying, "God, be merciful to me, a sinner!" ¹⁴ I tell you, this man went down to his home justified rather than the other; for all who exalt themselves will be humbled, but all who humble themselves will be exalted.'
