

Tomorrow, 24th October, is United Nations Day and so we are encouraged to turn our thoughts to the subject of world peace.
While Christians believe that one day God will "wipe away all tears", and

people will "beat their swords into ploughshares and their spears into pruning hooks" this doesn't mean that we

that a day will come when

should abstain from working for peace in practical ways now.

But this takes intelligence and astuteness, and an awareness of how easily we can be naive. Let us never forget those Anglican bishops and many others who supported Neville Chamberlain with his "peace in our time" appearement policies in the 1930's (a phrase taken indeed from the Book of Common Prayer), and those Christians even in our country who bought into communist-inspired "peace movements" in the 1950's and 60's.

Peacemaking is difficult and has to concentrate on the removal of fear and misunderstanding, and the removal of temptation from those who might otherwise think that victory could be bought at too cheap a price.

As Our Lord said, let us "be wise as serpents and innocent as doves". Tim Gibson.

GOSPEL OF THE DAY Luke 18.15-30

15 People were bringing even infants to him that he might touch them; and when the disciples saw it, they sternly ordered them not to do it. 16 But Jesus called for them and said, 'Let the little children come to me, and do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs. 17 Truly I tell you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will never enter it.' 18 A certain ruler asked him, 'Good Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?' 19 Jesus said to him, 'Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. 20 You know the commandments: "You shall not commit adultery; You shall not murder; You shall not steal; You shall not bear false witness; Honour your father and mother." '21 He replied, 'I have kept all these since my youth.' 22 When Jesus heard this, he said to him, 'There is still one thing lacking. Sell all that you own and distribute the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me.' 23 But when he heard this, he became sad; for he was very rich. 24 Jesus looked at him and said, 'How hard it is for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God! 25 Indeed, it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of God.' 26 Those who heard it said, 'Then who can be saved?' 27 He replied, 'What is impossible for mortals is possible for God.' 28 Then Peter said, 'Look, we have left our homes and followed you.' 29 And he said to them, 'Truly I tell you, there is no one who has left house or wife or brothers or parents or children, for the sake of the kingdom of God, 30 who will not get back very much more in this age, and in the age to come eternal life.'
