Dear people of St George's and St James',

The gospel reading this Sunday has some words from Our Lord concerning wars and insurrections, a feature of life in every era of human history, as we notice in the news bulletins each day and as were reminded of on Friday 11th November, Remembrance Day.

Throughout the ages Christians have exercised their minds about war, and whether it is ever justified. The doctrine of the "just war" was developed many centuries ago and there is general agreement today that World War 2 was "just", but with some reservations about the carpet bombing of parts of Germany and the use of the atomic bomb in Japan.

However we might theorise, the reality is that this nation does have armed forces, and the church believes that the members of those forces are as much in need of spiritual care as any other group in society. This is why we have chaplains in the Army, Navy and Air Force. They provide spiritual and pastoral care not just to the serving members, but to those members' families, and they have a role in advising the military command on matters of military ethics and personal welfare.

I believe we need to support the chaplains in their important work by praying for them and encouraging the diocesan authorities to recruit clergy for that special task.

The bell of St George the Martyr, Queenscliff - An article written by Fiona and published in the October Queenscliff Herald.

For many years there have been cockatoos, rather than bats, in the belfry at St George's Anglican Church in Queenscliff. The first stage of the tower restoration project that was completed mid- year has repaired the damage caused by the cockatoos and 160 years of salt air and high winds. However, the bell itself will no longer be used as originally designed as the vibration creates extreme wear and tear on the tower and on the bell

apparatus. The bell mechanism is simple: a cast iron yoke or collar is secured to timber beams and holds the bell and wheel. A rope is attached to the wheel and is pulled from the base of the tower. When the wheel turns, the bell swings and its clapper strikes the wall of the bell, thus creating the sonorous toll that can be heard across Queenscliff.

The bronze bell was cast by "John C Wilson Founder, Glasgow 1860". There is, sadly, no serial number to confirm the date of manufacture, but it may have been the only bell cast at this foundry in 1860.

When the bell returns to service within the next six months, it will operate with a new "bell hammer" system in which the bell remains stationary and the hammer moves to strike the bell wall - all programmed to work as required. Bells around the world have transferred to this system to minimise vibration and damage. In the meantime, we shall continue to use the recorded bell- chimes, with the speaker perched in the tower, when St George's is open for worship.

GOSPEL OF THE DAY - Luke 21.5-19

When some were speaking about the temple, how it was adorned with beautiful stones and gifts dedicated to God, he said, 'As for these things that you see, the days will come when not one stone will be left upon another; all will be thrown down.'

They asked him, 'Teacher, when will this be, and what will be the sign that this is about to take place?' And he said, 'Beware that you are not led astray; for many will come in my name and say, "I am he!" and, "The time is near!" Do not go after them.

'When you hear of wars and insurrections, do not be terrified; for these things must take place first, but the end will not follow immediately.' Then he said to them, 'Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom; there will be great earthquakes, and in various places famines and plagues; and there will be dreadful portents and great signs from heaven.

'But before all this occurs, they will arrest you and persecute you; they will hand you over to synagogues and prisons, and you will be brought before kings and governors because of my name. This will give you an

opportunity to testify. So make up your minds not to prepare your defence in advance; for I will give you words and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to withstand or contradict. You will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, by relatives and friends; and they will put some of you to death. You will be hated by all because of my name. But not a hair of your head will perish. By your endurance you will gain your souls.
