Dear people of St George's and St James',

The Advent Wreath stands before us during this season leading up to Christmas.

A wreath, being round, has no beginning or end, testifying to God's never-ending love for His people.

The candles represent the One who said "I am the light of the world". Our Advent prayer is that we may cast away "the works of darkness and put on the armour of light". Candles are lit on successive Sundays to symbolise the Coming of Christ.

The wreath is made of evergreens, an ancient symbol of immortality, reminding us that it is our belief in Christ that guarantees us everlasting life.

The appearance of the wreath and candles is not symmetric. It looks incomplete and unbalanced. This reminds us of our present existence, living precariously in the time of "not yet" between the First and Second Comings of Jesus.

The Advent wreath can be imagined as a stylised crown, and the colour of the candles is the ancient colour of royalty, but also the colour for penitence. This challenges us: are we sorry for our sins? Are we ready to face Christ the King "on the last day, when He comes again in His glorious majesty to judge the living and the dead."?

GOSPEL OF THE DAY Matthew 24.36-44

My name is Nithi and I am a Tamil refugee. We lost our dearest friend Samy on the 20th of November 2022 when he died of a heart body to be returned to his wife and daughter

in Sri Lanka for burial.

Samy, a young Sri Lankan Tamil asylum seeker living in Geelong, died suddenly from a heart attack. He came to Australia 10 years ago to seek refuge from persecution. He had hoped to be granted a protection visa and eventually bring his wife and daughter to safety. But Samy waited 10 years without being granted the visa he needed. He worked hard to support his family back home and tried to keep their hopes alive for a future of peace and safety together. Now those hopes have been lost forever and Samy's grieving wife has expressed her wish to have her husband's body returned to their village in Sri Lanka for burial.
