Dear people of St George's and St James',



We will be celebrating "All Saints" next Sunday (6th Nov.) but on Wednesday the focus will be on "All Souls", at a eucharist celebrated at the Queenscliff cemetery at 11am, to which all are invited.

Although "All Souls", as it is observed in the present time, originates probably some centuries

after the early Christians, its theme is always relevant: that of praying to God that all "the faithful departed" may share in the victory of the Risen Jesus.

So it is not so much a commemoration of the dead as it is a proclamation of the Resurrection. We express our love and affection for departed relatives and friends, but in the hope that we will be with them again in the next life.

Having the celebration of the All Souls eucharist in a cemetery makes a strong statement that amidst the tombs, some with their depressing wordings and imagery, Christians believe that death has no dominion and that what God treasures He will continue to draw closer to Himself.

PARISH SNAPSHOT

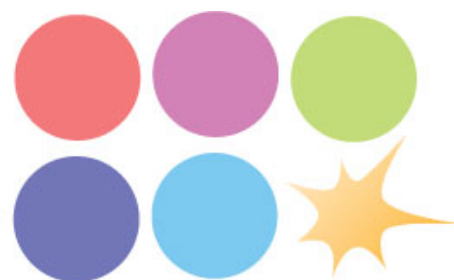

Luke 19.1-10

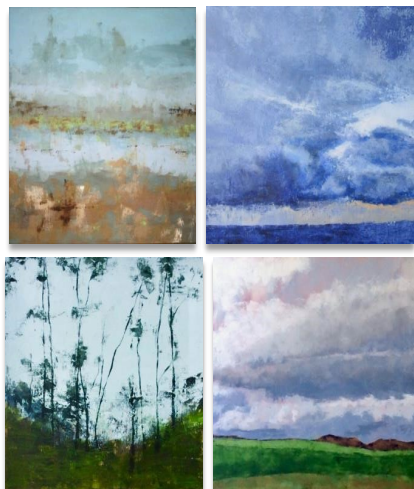
