

Dear people of St George's and St James',

The focus this past week has been on the saints and all those who have gone before us in the Faith, and on Tuesday there will be a special commemoration in our church calendar of "the Saints, Martyrs, Missionaries and Teachers of the Anglican Communion".

There are people from every continent, of every colour and many tongues, who have been pleased to call themselves "Church of England", "Anglican", or "Episcopalian". There is only one "Church" (with a capital "C") as there is only one Christ, but we Anglicans belong to a communion of "churches" (small "c") in which fellowship we seek to be loyal Christians.

"Anglicanism" is too often a tortuous Middle Way, with conservatives, evangelicals, protestants, anglo-catholics, liberals, moderates and "progressive orthodox" believers – and all shades in between – struggling at times for ascendancy.

Many find the stresses and strains of Anglicanism too great, but others remain in the "muddle" of a church (as Archbishop Michael Ramsey once called it!) because they hope for a Christian fellowship which can hold the best of all the Christian traditions (Rome, Canterbury, Geneva, Constantinople, etc etc.) in creative tension but full communion. It is a strand of Christianity that has produced many heroes and heroines. We celebrate them.

GOSPEL OF THE DAY Luke 20.27-40

²⁷ Some Sadducees, those who say there is no resurrection, came to him ²⁸ and asked him a question, 'Teacher, Moses wrote for us that if a man's brother dies, leaving a wife but no children, the man shall marry the widow and raise up children for his brother. ²⁹ Now there were seven brothers; the first married, and died childless; ³⁰ then the second ³¹ and the third married her, and so in the same way all seven died childless. ³² Finally the woman also died. ³³ In the resurrection, therefore, whose wife will the woman be? For the seven had married her.' ³⁴ Jesus said to them, 'Those who belong to this age marry and are given in marriage; ³⁵ but those who are considered worthy of a place in that age and in the resurrection from the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage. ³⁶ Indeed they cannot die any more, because they are like angels and are children of God, being children of the resurrection. ³⁷ And the fact that the dead are raised Moses himself showed, in the story about the bush, where he speaks of the Lord as the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob. ³⁸ Now he is God not of the dead, but of the living; for to him all of them are alive.' ³⁹ Then some of the scribes answered, 'Teacher, you have spoken well.' ⁴⁰ For they no longer dared to ask him another question.


