Dear people of St George's and St James',

ADVENT is now more than halfway through. It's a season of puzzle and paradox, heightened by the fact that the surrounding culture forces us to ignore it and to, rather, anticipate and indeed celebrate Christmas – weeks before Christmas Day. Even church organisations get caught up in this.

Perhaps this is because end-of-year festivities, and the feel-good joy and delight of the Bethlehem story, are much more palatable to us than considerations of repentance, hope, readiness for death, heaven, hell, and the coming of the Lord in judgement.

Nevertheless, the Advent customs in our Sunday worship stop us in our tracks if we notice them:

- * The saying of the Ten Commandments, confronting though they may be, reminding us of God's standards, and how we fall short of them
- * The omission of the Hymn of Praise (the "Gloria") and the sombre seasonal colours, remind us that God's true joy blossoms forth only after a period of denial, preparation and waiting
- * The unevenness and incompleteness of the Advent Candles, reminding us that we live in the tension between the "now" and the "not yet" of the gospel.

From James McAuley's hymn "Come, O Jesus, come, O Lord":

In Advent we commemorate the first great coming of the Lord and, looking forward, celebrate the day when all shall be restored.

FROM THE HISTORY ROOM -P Ladies Guild - Time Capsule

Created in 1996 to mark the Jubilee Year of the St James' Ladies Guild, the capsule was opened last week, at the Annual Parish Meeting 2nd of December 2022. The contents include many photographs of members and events, Guild minute books, one covering the years1965 – 1984, and a Guild Ledger book covering



many decades 1947 – 1978. A number of quite early 'newsletters' of both St James' and St George's and several wedding and funeral booklets and other church commemorations. Of significant interest are documents and photographs related to the history of the 'concert party' which later became "The Guilders".

The parish archives hold a number of DVDs of these concerts dating from 1974 – 1988, written from the original video tape recordings by Jim Thyer. Papers from the capsule indicate that the 'Concert Party' as they first called themselves was created in 1965 by Freda Maude, Mollie Traill and Vera Harrison as a fundraiser for St James'. It will be good to know more of these early years.

The small concert group was an immediate success and became very popular. In 1974 Kit Mills, a retiree to Point Lonsdale, who had significant stage experience in England. became Director of what soon came to be known as *The Guilders*. Concerts played across several days and became much more ambitious. They were held annually throughout the 1980s. Everyone who went to these concerts has spoken enthusiastically about the incredibly high standard Kit Mills achieved with her local women and how very enjoyable and hilarious they were.

The concerts were all staged in the first "old Gill Hall", which by the late 1980s had become decrepit and hardly fit for purpose. There are several accounts of the trying conditions [very hot or cold & a tiny area for dressing]. The following poem, in the parish newsletter, retrieved from the Time Capsule, attests to the need for a new hall:

There was a movement at St James'
For the word had got around
That Old Gill Hall was cracking up
It was no longer sound
The Vicar he was worried
The Vestry likewise
But
The Ladies efforts will prevail
Despite the ageing hall!

The Gill Hall we know now was opened in 1990 and was significantly funded from donations and the moneys raised by the Ladies Guild. The concerts raised a tremendous amount of money.

Perhaps an afternoon tea along with a viewing from the 1980s concerts could be arranged sometime early 2023. Carole Barwick
