
The 2nd February is the 40th day after the celebration of Christ's birth, and is observed as the

" Presentation of Christ in the Temple".

The gospel reading for the day tells the story of the child Jesus being brought to the Jerusalem Temple and being recognised as a " light that will bring revelation to the Gentiles". This reference has led to " Candlemas" customs on this day.

But note who it is who recognises the significance of Jesus: an elderly man, Simeon. And later in the story another elderly person, Anna, plays an important part in spreading the message of the meaning of this child.

Our society today tends to downgrade elderly people -- and yet the proportion of them in our nation is increasing! There is a "cult of youth", promoted by the advertising and sporting industries, and the power that this cult wields is demonstrated when people say -- and perhaps even believe -- that "young people won't come to church because it is full of old people". Racism may be on the wane, but "ageism" is with us with a vengeance!



We may get to the stage where the church is the only "institution" left which gives the older person a real sense of purpose and dignity.


Let us value the older members of our community, and of our church community. Let us expect that they, like Simeon and Anna, will sometimes (often!) surprise us with what they can discern about God's purposes for us all.
