Dear friends.

The 40 days of Lent begin on Ash Wednesday. I once heard an eccentric priest describe Lent as the time when " the Church, the Mystical Body of Christ, mourns sin". It's taken me years to work out what he meant by that. Perhaps it is that in many cultures the process of " mourning"

often involves special things one does and are seen to do. Christians have traditionally used this season of the year to become more committed to their Faith by means of the 3 Lenten disciplines:

FASTING: " Go without something" each day ... some material pleasure or activity, something you will miss e.g. a meal, some luxury, a favourite TV program. But use the time/money saved for prayer and almsgiving.

ALMSGIVING: Re-assess your financial priorities, and give extra to those in need (e.g. Via the parish' Lenten project) and put yourself out for others with positive acts of serving.

PRAYER: Examine your personal Rule of Life. Does it need updating ?

Indeed, do you have a Rule of Life? It would need to cover such things as daily prayer, spiritual reading, church attendance, etc. Perhaps consider joining in one or more of the "zoom" groups mentioned on page 4 of the newsletter.

A good observance of Lent enhances our appreciation of the Easter season. Tim Gibson.

World day of Prayer 2023 will be on Friday March 3rd at Uniting Church, 85 Hese St, Queensciff. The host country this year is Taiwan.

In this way, it is possible to enrich our Christian faith as it grows deeper and broader in an international, ecumenical expression.

GOSPEL OF THE DAY Matthew 17.1-9

1 Six days later, Jesus took with him Peter and James and his brother John and led them up a high mountain, by themselves. 2 And he was transfigured before them, and his face shone like the sun, and his clothes became dazzling white. 3 Suddenly there

appeared to them Moses and Elijah, talking with him. 4 Then Peter said to Jesus, 'Lord, it is good for us to be here; if you wish, I will make three dwellings here, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah.' 5 While he was still speaking, suddenly a bright cloud overshadowed them, and from the cloud a voice said, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; with him I am well pleased; listen to him!' 6 When the disciples heard this, they fell to the ground and were overcome by fear. 7 But Jesus came and touched them, saying, 'Get up and do not be afraid.' 8 And when they looked up, they saw no one except Jesus himself alone. 9 As they were coming down the mountain, Jesus ordered them, 'Tell no one about the vision until after the Son of Man has been raised from the dead.'
