#### THIS MONTH, FEBRUARY, SUNDAY 10AM WORSHIP AT ST GEORGES QUEENSCLIFF



The 3rd February marked the 235th anniversary of the first Christian church service conducted on the Australian continent. It was held in the open air, on the shores of Sydney Cove, 8 days after the landing, attended by the colonising troops and the convicts, and conducted by the Chaplain to the First Fleet, the Rev'd Richard Johnson.

Due to the religious attitudes of the age, and the various important priorities of the convict settlement, no immediate steps were taken to build a church and it took 6 years before Johnson was able to build a wattle and daub chapel, and he did this at his own expense. The site of this chapel is commemorated with a monument deep in the heart of what is now Sydney's financial district.

The building was burnt down, probably as a result of arson, and another one built. Johnson did not find himself well-supported in those early days. Yet from those unpromising circumstances has developed the Anglican Church of Australia of which we are part.

"Richard Johnson Anglican School" in western Sydney commemorates this pioneer of Christianity in Australia. Tim Gibson.

#### GOSPEL OF THE DAY Matthew 5.13-20

<sup>13</sup> 'You are the salt of the earth; but if salt has lost its taste, how can its saltiness be restored? It is no longer good for anything, but is thrown out and trampled under foot. <sup>14</sup> 'You are the light of the world.
